You would like to see joint parent/child success celebrated on a larger scale with groups rather than highlighting individual families

You were concerned over the options of flavoured milk and squash at lunch times

Created a 'Parental Success' section in the newsletter where we will celebrate the joint learning between parents, children and school and all the ways in which groups of parents contribute to the success of their own and other children's learning

We contacted Educaterers to answer your concerns. They confirmed that:

Squash is not served. We serve fruit juice from concentrate mixed with water to the permitted dilution ratio. We also offer water, organic semi skimmed milk and organic semi skimmed milk mixed with a low sugar chocolate milk shake mix which is less than 5% sugar. All the drinks provided meet The School Food Standards.

All menus are planned following the school food trust standard policy. Educaterers also hold a silver 'Food for Life' accreditation in line with the Soil Association. More information can be found on the Educaterers website https://educaterers.co.uk/. When new dishes or products are introduced to the menu, they are tasted at school with the pupils. We also sent a survey to ask the opinions of all parents on this matter, to help shape the way forward

The results of this showed that:

The large majority of parents would prefer to keep the lunch drinks served as they are. We will therefore continue with the current provision
